

Eleven and Out

OBJECTIVES: To move **diagonally** across the board through the '6,' and cover all of your squares before your partner finishes their opposing diagonal.

MATERIALS: (each player)

3 dice (to share)
11 clear markers (different colors for each player)
game board to share
desk mats to quiet the dice

BEST USE: Review basic facts through a combination of addition, subtraction, multiplication and division.

RULES:

1. Begin in your START box. You and your partner will meet and cross paths in the middle '6' box.
2. Roll 3 dice. Look at your closest, uncovered game board square. Select a math operation using the 2 or 3 of the dice to equal that number. Tell your partner your math operation and solution.
3. If your problem and solution are correct, cover that box with a marker. You and your partner must agree that the solution is correct. Pass the dice to your partner to start a turn.
4. If you are not able to create a combination of operations to equal the next square, your turn ends. Pass the dice to your partner without covering that square.

OPTIONS:

Add a poly-sided die.

For a longer game, cross the diagonal and play to the end before you turn back and return to your beginning square to complete a round.

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
